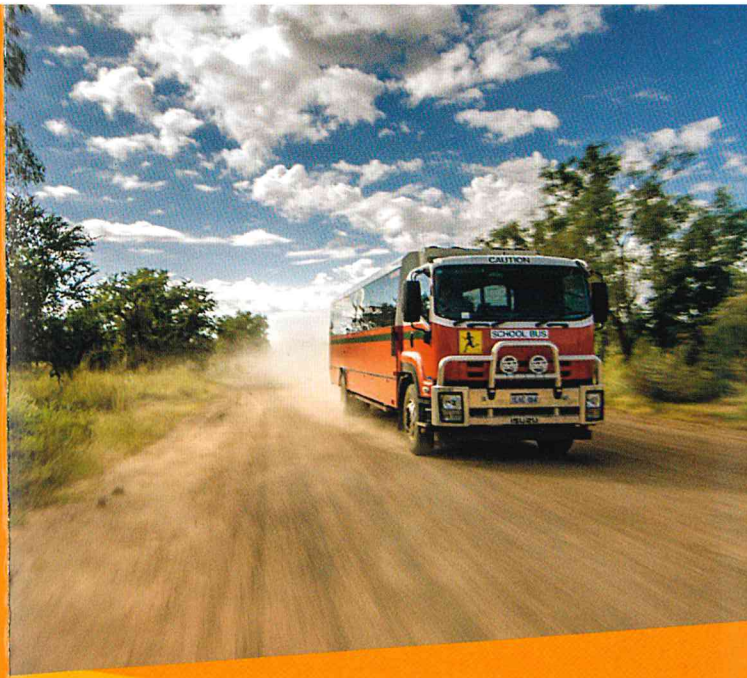


Student Transport Assistance

The Government of Western Australia has been providing Transport Assistance to Western Australian families for nearly 100 years. Over this time the orange school bus fleet has grown to more than 950 buses, transporting 30,000 students, more than 170,000 km each school day.

The size of our state dictates that many families live great distances from their local school. School Bus Services (SBS) relieves the burden on these families by providing free transport to Eligible Students to and from their Nearest Appropriate School.

We also provide orange school bus services for students with special needs. If your child has a special need, please refer to the 'Education Support Facilities and Language Development Centres' section for more information on eligibility for Transport Assistance.



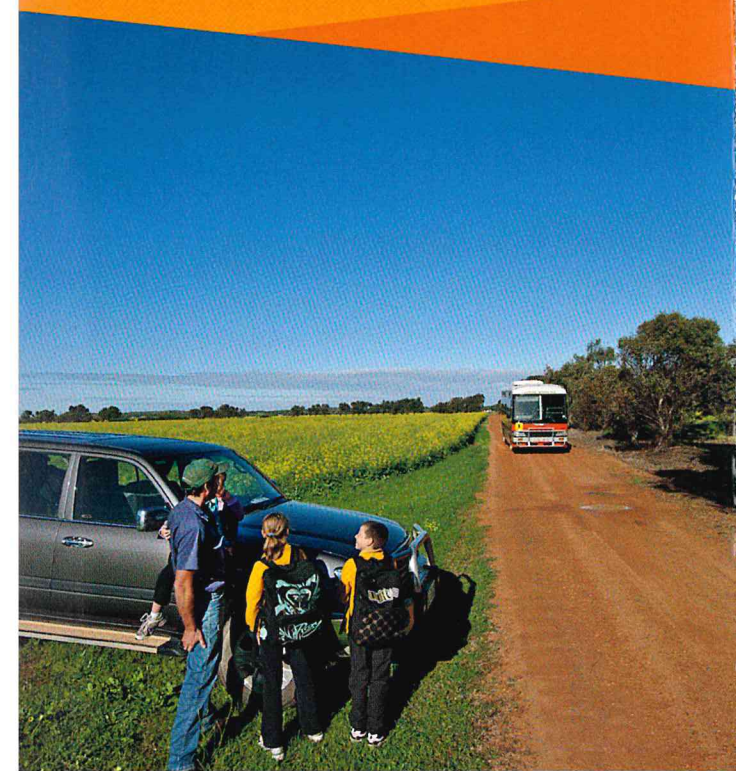

Is my child eligible for Transport Assistance?

Before applying for Student Transport Assistance, we need to determine your eligibility.

SBS will assess your application against the appropriate criteria to determine eligibility for travel on a school bus or a Conveyance Allowance.

Mainstream Schools.

Please answer YES or NO to each of the following questions:

- Is your child enrolled at their Nearest Appropriate School?
- Is your child enrolled in a pre-compulsory or compulsory education period?
- Will your child use the school bus for at least six trips per week?
- Do you reside more than 4.5 km from your child's school?
- Do you reside outside of a designated Public Transport Area? For information on Public Transport Areas, please visit schoolbuses.wa.gov.au

If you have answered YES to all of these questions, you may be eligible for Transport Assistance. Please read the 'Applying Online' section in this brochure.

If you answered NO to any of these questions, you can still request access to SBS services by applying to be considered a Complimentary Passenger. For information regarding complimentary travel, please visit the 'Parents' page on schoolbuses.wa.gov.au

Education Support Facilities and Language Development Centres.

Please answer YES or NO to each of the following questions:

- Is your child enrolled at the closest Government or Non-Government Education Support Facility or Language Development Centre?

- Is your child under 19 years of age?
- Will your child use the school bus for at least six trips per week?
- Is your child incapable of making their own way to school safely?

If you have answered YES to all of these questions, you may be eligible for Transport Assistance. Please read the 'Applying Online' section in this brochure.

If you answered NO to any of these questions, you can still request bus access by applying to be considered a Complimentary Passenger. For information regarding complimentary travel, please visit the 'Parents' page on the SBS website at schoolbuses.wa.gov.au

Medical conditions

If your child has a medical condition you will need to provide detailed information upon application.

Conveyance Allowance

In some areas, where it is neither practical nor cost effective to provide a dedicated school bus service, SBS will offer an Eligible Student's family a Conveyance Allowance.

A Conveyance Allowance is an amount paid on a per kilometre basis to a parent/carer to help meet the cost of transporting a student to and from school. This allowance is intended to assist with the running cost of utilising your private motor vehicle.

Change of details

If you are already registered with SBS and need to modify your details, you can do so on the website. The 'Change of Details' form can be used to modify the following information:

- Contact telephone number(s) or email address
- Alternative/emergency contact details
- Bank account details

You are required to complete a new Application for Transport Assistance if you are changing details relating to:

- Residential Address
- School (including when your child is moving from Primary School to High School)
- Custodial issues/shared custody arrangements
- Medical conditions
- Increased usage of the service.

SBS will assess the application to determine if the change in circumstances has altered your entitlement, and what affect this may have on your transport assistance.

Applying online

To apply for Student Transport Assistance follow the steps below:
